Message from the Commissioner

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HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

Determine the town and county of the water body you will be fishing. The use of a Maine map or atlas will help you locate the water body you are planning to fish.

If a body of water is not listed, then the general law (page 5) and county regulations (page 16 or 44) apply. If the body of water is listed, it will be followed by special rules that apply (see S-Codes on page 7).

Portions of Maine Statute, Title 12 have been summarized for this publication. For the detailed language contained in Title 12, please visit our website at www.mefishwildlife.com.

Each revision of this publication is filed with the Secretary of State and, as a result, the rules herein have the force of law as printed.

NEW REGULATIONS IN THIS BOOK

The following are some of the more significant general rule changes for the open water and ice fishing seasons. In addition there are numerous changes on individual waters. Please check the body of water you will be fishing.

- 1) This lawbook contains both open water and ice fishing regulations for the period beginning April 1, 2010 through March 31, 2012. Please keep this lawbook until April 1, 2012!
- 2) Many of the Special Rules Codes (S-Codes) have changed. Please review page 7 for these changes.
- 3) For lakes and ponds in Hancock, Penobscot, and Washington Counties daily bag limit on brook trout is 2 fish unless otherwise specified by individual waters.
- 4) Fishing opportunities have been expanded on many lakes and ponds throughout the state. Changes include:
 - Most waters currently open to ice fishing are now also open to open water fishing during the same time period.
 - Class A ice fishing waters are now open from December 1 through April 30.
 - Most lakes and ponds in Southern and Eastern Counties are open to fishing year-round.

Free Family Fishing Days

Will take place on May 29 & 30, 2010, February 19 & 20, 2011, May 28 & 29, 2011, and February 18 & 19, 2012. On these days, any person (except those whose license has been suspended or revoked) may fish without a license.

All other laws and regulations apply on these days.

The daily bag, possession and minimum length limits on this page apply to waters open to fishing that DO NOT have special rules stating otherwise. Special Rules (S-Codes) can be found on page 7.

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

No resident of this state, 16 years of age or older, or nonresident, 12 years of age or older, may fish in inland waters or transport fish taken from inland waters without first obtaining a valid Maine fishing license. Maine Residents* may obtain fishing licenses from any resident license agent. Non-Residents** may obtain fishing licenses — in person or by mail from the IF&W Department Office in Augusta or from any of the numerous nonresident license agents throughout the State. Residents AND Nonresidents are also able to purchase licenses on our website: www.mefishwildlife.com

Unless otherwise specifically provided, all fishing licenses expire on December 31 of the calendar year for which they were issued.

FREE FISHING LICENSE PROVISIONS:

- A free fishing license will be issued, upon application, to the following:
- 1) Any Maine resident* who is blind;
 - 2) Any Maine Indian who is a member of the Passamaquoddy, Penobscot, Maliseet ,or Micmac Tribe (must obtain licenses from their respective tribal headquarters);
 - 3) Any Maine resident who is a war veteran, has a service connected disability of 100% or has served in a combat zone and has a service connected disability of 70% or more;
 - 4) Any Maine resident (or nonresident, if reciprocal privileges exist in the home state of the nonresident) who is suffering from the loss, or loss of use, of both lower extremities;
 - 5) Any mentally retarded person (as defined in Title 34-B, §5001, sub-§3);
 - 6) Any person with a head injury (as defined in Title 22, §3086).
- (These free licenses may be obtained at the Department Office in Augusta.)

*Resident means a citizen of the United States who is domiciled in this State or an alien who has been so domiciled for one year. You will not be considered a resident unless:

- a) if registered to vote, registered in Maine;
- b) if licensed to drive a motor vehicle, applied for a Maine motor vehicle license;
- c) if owning a motor vehicle(s) located within the State, registered each vehicle in Maine;
- d) complied with the State income tax laws; and
- e) if a full-time student at a Maine college or university, resides in Maine AND satisfies above requirements.

**Non-Resident means a person who does not fall within the definition of resident.

SUPERSPORT DESIGNATION: A supersport designation may be obtained for an additional fee of \$20.

A Supersport designation does not allow any hunting or fishing privileges, but money generated by the sale of Supersport designations goes directly to support the Landowner Relations Program. The Landowner Relations Program works to ensure recreational access to Maine’s outdoors.

*** 1-day fishing license may be exchanged by a Maine resident for a season fishing or combination hunting and fishing license upon payment of the difference between that fee and the fee for the annual license, plus the agent’s fee.

**** Maine resident permanently stationed outside the state of Maine.

***** Nonresident 15-day fishing license may be exchanged for a nonresident season fishing license upon payment of \$17 plus the agent’s fee.

SPECIAL RULES FOR ICE FISHING AND OPEN WATER FISHING (S-CODES)

- S-1: Closed to taking smelts.
- S-2: Closed to taking smelts, except by hook and line.
- S-3: Tributaries closed to taking smelts.
- S-4: Use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited. (The use of dead fish, salmon eggs, and worms permitted.)
- S-5: Fly fishing only.
- S-6: Artificial lures only.
- S-7: All trout, landlocked salmon, and togue caught must be released alive at once.
- S-8: Restricted to 2 lines per person.
- S-9: Open to fishing only for persons under 16 years of age. Restricted to two lines per person. Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish.
- S-10: Remains open to open water fishing from October 1 - November 30: artificial lures only; all trout, landlocked salmon and togue must be released alive at once. Closed to open water fishing from December 1 - March 31.
- S-11: Reserved for additional options.
- S-12: Reserved for additional options.
- S-13: No size or bag limit on bass.
- S-14: Daily bag limit on bass: 1 fish; all bass between 16 and 20 inches must be released alive at once.
- S-15: All bass between 13 and 18 inches must be released alive at once. April 1 - June 30: daily bag limit on bass: 1 fish. July 1 - March 31: daily bag limit on bass: 2 fish.
- S-16: Daily bag limit on trout 2 fish; minimum length limit: 12 inches, only 1 may exceed 14 inches.
- S-17: Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish; minimum length limit: 10 inches, only 1 may exceed 12 inches.
- S-18: Daily bag limit on trout: 1 fish; minimum length limit: 18 inches.
- S-19: Daily bag limit on trout: 2 fish.
- S-20: All trout less than 6 inches and longer than 12 inches must be released alive at once.
- S-21: Daily bag limit on trout: 1 fish; minimum length limit: 14 inches.
- S-22: Daily bag limit on landlocked salmon: 1 fish.
- S-23: Minimum length on landlocked salmon: 16 inches.
- S-24: Daily bag limit on landlocked salmon: 3 fish; minimum length limit: 12 inches.
- S-25: Daily bag limit on togue: 1 fish.
- S-26: Daily bag limit on togue: 3 fish; minimum length limit: 14 inches, only 1 may exceed 18 inches.
- S-27: Daily bag limit on togue: 6 fish; minimum length limit: 14 inches, only 1 may exceed 23 inches.
- S-28: Daily bag limit on white perch: 25 fish.
- S-29: No bag limit on pickerel. From July 1 - September 30: artificial lures only; the minimum length on trout is 8 inches.
- S-30: Indian Territory Regulations. See pages 89-93.
- S-31: Boundary waters with New Brunswick. See pages 93-95.
- S-32: Border waters with New Hampshire. See pages 95-97.
- S-33: Maximum length on landlocked salmon and brown trout: 25 inches.

FISHING LAWS AND DEFINITIONS

ADVANCE BAITING: It is unlawful to deposit any meat, bones, dead fish or other food material in inland waters for the purpose of luring fish. However, it is lawful to place food particles in a baitfish trap for the purpose of luring baitfish. (12657)

ALEWIVES: A licensed fisherman may take one bushel of alewives daily from inland waters by use of a dip net or single hook and line for consumption by himself or members of his family, except that alewives may not be taken from waters where a municipality or individual has been granted exclusive rights under laws regulating marine resources. (12506)

ARTIFICIAL LURE: Any fishing lure constructed by humans as an imitation or substitute for natural bait or fish forage and includes, but is not limited to artificial flies, spinners, spoons, poppers, plugs, jigs and plastic, rubber or other artificial imitations of natural bait. An artificial lures only rule prohibits the use of any live, dead or chemically preserved natural or organic bait or food.

BAG LIMIT (ALL FISH): Any fish, except baitfish and smelts, legally taken from inland waters shall be immediately released alive into the water from which it was taken, or killed at once. Any fish killed becomes part of the daily bag limit. (12611)

BAIT CONTAINERS: A person selling bait may not provide or sell the bait in containers composed in whole or in part of polystyrene foam plastic. This does not apply to bait fish. (12553-2)

BASS: The term “bass” includes largemouth and smallmouth.

BROOK TROUT: The term “brook trout” includes brook trout, splake, and Arctic charr (Sunapee trout and blueback trout).

CLOSED WATERS: All inland waters, including those in Indian Territory (See pages 89-93), are closed to ice fishing except those opened by rule.

COUNTY LINES: Whenever county lines divide a body of water, the more liberal county rule applies to the entire body of water.

CUSK LINES: All lines set through the ice at night (sunset to sunrise) for cusk must be checked at least once every hour by the person who set them.

DIP NET: A device consisting of a rigid frame filled with netting, firmly attached to a rigid handle and manually operated by a single person.

FAILURE TO LABEL FISH: It is unlawful to keep bass, landlocked salmon, togue (lake trout) or trout at any sporting camp, hotel, public lodging place or any place other than a person’s residence without attaching the name and address of the person who caught the fish. (12608)

FISHWAYS ASSOCIATED WITH DAMS: The area within 150 feet of any operational fishway is closed to fishing except:

- At the following places, the fishway and the area within 75 feet of any part of the fishway are closed to fishing at all times:
 - (1) Grand Falls Powerhouse Dam on St. Croix River in Baileyville.
 - (2) Woodland Dam on the St. Croix River in Baileyville.
- At the following places, the area within 75 feet of the mouth of the fishway is closed to fishing at all times:
 - (1) East Grand Lake Dam in Forest City Twp. (T9R4 NBPP).
 - (2) Spednic Lake Dam in Vanceboro.
- At the so-called ice control dam on the Narraguagus River in the Town of Cherryfield, the area within 100 feet of the dam is closed to fishing at all times.
- At the East Outlet Dam on the outlet of Moosehead Lake in Sapling Twp. (T1R7 BKP WKR) in Somerset County and in Big Moose Twp. (T2R6 BKP EKR) in Piscataquis County, the fishway and the area within 50 feet of any part of the fishway is closed to fishing at all times.
- There is no fishing in or from the fishway at the Sheepscot Lake Dam in the Town of Palermo in Waldo County.

(Note: These provisions do not restrict the taking of alewives and smelts in accordance with laws regulating marine resources). (12457)

FLY (ARTIFICIAL FLY): A single-pointed hook dressed with feathers, hair, thread, tinsel, or any similar material to which no additional hook, spinner, spoon or similar device is added.

FLY FISHING: Casting upon water and retrieving in a manner in which the weight of the fly line propels the fly. No more than 3 unbaited artificial flies individually attached to a line may be used. (NOTE: It is unlawful to troll a fly in waters restricted to fly fishing only).

HOOK: A single fish hook constructed with 1, 2 or 3 points.

ICE FISHING: Taking freshwater fish during the ice fishing season through man-made openings in the ice by the use of ice fishing implements. It is unlawful to open water fish in inland waters while positioned on ice.

ICE FISHING IMPLEMENT: Any lawful fishing implement used to take fish through the ice including a trap (tip-up), jig stick, rod in hand or handline, except that a person engaged in taking smelts and bait fish may do so in accordance with the laws and rules governing these activities.

ICE FISHING SHACK: A person who owns any shack or temporary structure used for ice fishing:

- May not leave or allow the shack or structure to remain on the ice of any inland waters after April 1st; and
- Shall have painted on the outside of the shack or structure in 2-inch letters, the owner's name and address when the shack or structure is on the ice of any inland waters.

ICE FISHING TRAP (TIP-UP): An ice fishing implement for storing line, designed to be set through the ice and to indicate when something has disturbed the attached bait.

ILLEGAL IMPLEMENTS, USE OF:

- A. Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful to possess any grapnel, trawl, weir, seine, gill net, trap, set line or drop net on or adjacent to any of the inland waters of this State.
- B. Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful to fish with a grapnel, spear, spear gun, trawl, weir, gaff, seine, gill net, trap, or set lines. (12656)

ILLEGAL FISHING: Except as otherwise provided, it is unlawful to fish other than with a single baited hook and line, artificial flies or artificial lures and spinners.

Exception: This does not apply to hook and line smelt fishing. All other rules and regulations governing the taking of smelt apply. Use of a gaff is unlawful. (12654)

ILLEGAL USE OF ANTIFREEZE: Adding substances containing ethylene glycol or other antifreeze agents to waters of this State is illegal. (Title 38, §413)

IMPORTATION OF FISH: It is unlawful to import any live freshwater fish or eggs into this State without written permission from the Commissioner. (12556)

LEAD SINKERS: It is unlawful to sell or offer for sale a lead sinker for fishing that weighs 1/2 ounce or less. This does not include artificial lures, weighted line or lines, or jig heads. (12663-A)

LINE RESTRICTIONS: Unless otherwise provided by rule, the number of lines an angler may fish at any one time is limited to two lines while open water fishing and five lines while ice fishing. At no time may an angler fish with more than five lines.

LITTER: It is unlawful to dispose of litter (including abandoned ice fishing shacks) anywhere in this State, except in areas or receptacles designed for that purpose. Convicted violators face fines up to \$200 for the first offense and up to \$500 for subsequent offenses.

MARKING FISH: It is unlawful to tag, fin clip, or otherwise mark any fish to be released alive into the inland waters of the State without the written consent of the Commissioner.

MINIMUM LEGAL LENGTH: The total length of a fish measured from the tip of the snout to the tip of the tail, with the lobes of the tail squeezed together.

NIGHT FISHING: Except as otherwise provided by rule, all waters open to fishing are open to fishing 24 hours a day. All lines must be under the immediate supervision of the person who set them. Exception: All lines set through the ice at night for cusk must be checked at least once every hour by the person who set them.

NOTICE OF SUBMERGED VEHICLE: The owner of any motor vehicle, all terrain vehicle or snowmobile that becomes submerged, or partially submerged, in the waters

of the State shall immediately notify the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife of the event and the location of the vehicle. The owner is legally liable for removal and to pay any damages resulting from the submersion or removal. Motor vehicles shall be removed within 30 days (same day if public water supply). Snowmobiles and ATVs shall be removed within 24 hours.

OPEN WATER FISHING: Taking freshwater fish during the open water fishing season by means of hook and line in hand, or attached to a rod, or by casting or trolling artificial flies, lures, or baited hooks, provided that the person angling does not take fish through a man made hole in the ice, from the ice or from any object supported by the ice.

POSSESSION LIMIT (ALL FISH): A person shall not possess at any time more fish than may lawfully be taken in one day.

RAILROAD TRACK RESTRICTIONS: A person may not, without right, stand or walk on a railroad track or railroad bridge or pass over a railroad bridge except by railroad conveyance. For penalties see Title 23, Chapter 611, § 7007.

REMOVAL OF BAG LIMITS ON BASS: In waters where the bag limit on bass has been removed by special rule, the season on bass and the method of fishing for them is the same as for trout and salmon.

REMOVAL OF HEADS AND TAILS: It is unlawful to alter the length of landlocked salmon, trout, togue, lake whitefish, and bass unless the fish are being prepared for immediate cooking. It is unlawful to possess or transport fish dressed in such a manner that the species of fish cannot be identified; unless the fish are being prepared for immediate cooking (smoking does not constitute cooking).

SALE OF CERTAIN FISH PROHIBITED: It is unlawful to buy or sell, directly or indirectly, trout, togue, landlocked salmon, bass, white perch, or pickerel (except fish which have been lawfully produced by commercial producers and skins of fish which have been preserved by taxidermy). (12609-A)

SALMON: The term “Salmon”, when used alone, means the same as landlocked salmon.

SALMON EGGS AS BAIT: Commercially prepared eggs from species that do not naturally occur in this State may be used for bait. (12553)

SEASON DATES: All dates are inclusive.

SET LINE: A line extending into the water and rigged to catch fish that has one end secured to the shore, or to a fixed or buoyant object, that is not personally attended. Exception: lines set through the ice for cusk at night.

SINGLE-BAITED HOOK: A single-baited apparatus designed to catch only one fish at a time.

SMELTING: A person holding a valid Maine fishing license may take smelts for recreational purposes only from the inland waters or portions of inland waters that are naturally free of ice with a dip net in the usual and ordinary way from noon to 2:00 a.m. in accordance with bag limits established by rule. Bag limits established by rule under this paragraph are for a 24-hour period, beginning at noon on a given day and ending at 11:59 a.m. the following day. A person may not keep more than 5 dozen smelts alive as part of that person's daily bag limit. A person may not take smelts with a dip net unless that dip net meets the requirements listed on page 8. A dip net when used to take smelts in a tributary or within 100 feet of the mouth of a tributary must contain a rigid circular frame that is not more than 24 inches in diameter as measured at any point on the hoop and manually operated by a single person. NOTE: An unlimited number of baited hooks may be used on your line while fishing for smelts.

SNAGGING: To fish by manipulating a hook or hooks in such a manner as to pierce or snag the fish in a part of the body other than the mouth. It is unlawful to fish for any fish, except suckers, by snagging. (12651)

SPECIAL BAG LIMIT: Whenever any waters have a special bag limit, no person shall possess more than one day's bag limit taken from those waters.

SPECIES IDENTIFICATION: It is unlawful to possess or transport fish dressed in such a manner that the species of the fish cannot be identified unless the fish are being prepared for immediate cooking. (Smoking does not constitute cooking).

SUCKERS: Persons licensed, or otherwise entitled to fish, may take suckers for their own use between April 1st and June 30th from all rivers, brooks, and streams open to fishing by use of a hand spear, bow and arrow or by snagging. (Note: If suckers are taken by bow and arrow, the arrow must have a barbed or pronged point and must be attached to the bow with a line). (12506)

SUPERVISION OF LINES: All lines must be under the immediate supervision of the person who set them. Exception: All lines set through the ice at night for cusk must be checked at least once every hour by the person who set them.

TEN-ACRE PONDS: All ponds of 10 acres or less formed on brooks, streams, or rivers are governed by the same fishing rule(s) that apply to the brook, stream, or river where the pond is situated, whether the pond is natural or artificial. (This does not apply to private ponds.)

TERMINAL GEAR: Tackle at the end of a line used to catch fish, including baited and unbaited hooks, artificial lures and baits, and artificial flies. Fishing under general law allows the use of any of these terminal gear types.

THOROUGHFARES: Waterways connecting lakes and/or ponds. The general fishing laws governing lakes and ponds also apply to thoroughfares (includes seasons, bag limits, length limits, etc.)

TO FISH: To catch, handle, take or kill, or attempt to catch, handle, take or kill any fish.

TRIBUTARY: A brook, stream, or river flowing directly or indirectly into a lake, pond, or another brook, stream, or river. A lake or great pond shall not be construed to mean tributary. The tributary to a great pond shall not be considered a tributary to the outlet of that great pond.

TROLL: To fish by trailing a line rigged to catch fish behind or in front of a watercraft being propelled by mechanical, wind or manual power. (Tandem flies are allowed when trolling.)

TROUT: The term “trout” when used alone, includes brook trout, brown trout, rainbow trout, Arctic charr (Sunapee trout and blueback trout), and splake. The term “brook trout” includes brook trout, splake and Arctic charr (Sunapee trout and blueback trout).

USE OF EXPLOSIVE, POISONOUS OR STUPEFYING SUBSTANCE: It is unlawful to take or destroy any fish by use of an explosive, poisonous or stupefying substance. (12653)

USE OF LIVE FISH AS BAIT: See laws on page 14 concerning the use of live bait fish.

VIOLATION OF LIMITS: It is unlawful to fish for or possess fish in violation of the number, amount, or size limits of any rule adopted by the Commissioner. (12602)

LAWS PERTAINING TO BAIT DEALERS AND USE OF LIVE BAIT FISH

Live bait fish restrictions. The following are legal bait fish for fishing: smelt, lake chub, eastern silvery minnow, golden shiner, emerald shiner, bridle shiner, blacknose shiner, common shiner, spottail shiner, northern redbelly dace, finescale dace, fathead minnow, blacknose dace, longnose dace, creek chub, fallfish, pearl dace, banded killifish, mummichog, longnose sucker, white sucker, creek chub sucker and American eel. Any species of fish not listed above may not be used as bait for fishing in inland waters.

Importation of bait fish prohibited. It is unlawful to import any live bait fish or smelts into Maine.

Bait Dealer's license. It is unlawful for any person to deal in live bait fish or live smelts without first obtaining a valid dealer's license. For further information, contact IF&W (NOTE: A person may take live bait fish for their own use, by the use of hook and line or bait trap only, if that person holds a valid fishing license.)

Permit to take bait fish from closed waters. Any person (except licensed bait dealers who receive a permit upon issuance of a license) who wishes to take live bait fish from inland waters which are NOT CURRENTLY OPEN to fishing must first obtain a written permit from this Department. There is no charge for this permit. (NOTE: No permit is required to take bait fish from inland waters open to fishing.)


Bait fish traps to be marked. All bait fish traps and bait fish holding boxes must be marked with the name and address of the person who is taking or holding the bait fish.

Checking bait fish traps. All bait fish traps must be checked at least once every 7 calendar days by the person who set them.

Storing live bait fish. Live bait fish may not be stored or held in any waters where the use or possession of live fish as bait is prohibited during the entire ice fishing or the entire open water fishing season. This includes waters restricted to the use of artificial lures only, waters restricted to fly fishing, and where there are other prohibitions on the use of live fish as bait. To obtain a list of Maine waters where bait fish cannot be stored please contact IFW's Augusta Office, or visit IFW's website: www.mefishwildlife.com.

Marking holes. When using drop nets to fish through the ice for bait fish/smelts, all holes made in the ice MUST BE MARKED either by evergreen boughs placed around the hole, or by suspending at least 1 strand of fluorescent biodegradable tape at least 3 feet above the ice around the entire perimeter of the hole so that the tape is visible from all sides.

FISHING RULES FOR THE SOUTHERN AND EASTERN COUNTIES

(Androscoggin, Cumberland, Hancock, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, Oxford south of the Androscoggin River, Penobscot, Sagadahoc, Waldo, Washington, and York)

Lakes and Ponds:

- From January 1 - December 31: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, open to all fishing (includes both ice and open water fishing).
- From January 1 - September 30: Unless indicated otherwise under the appropriate county, general law length and bag limits apply to all fish caught while open water fishing or ice fishing (see page 5).
- From October 1 - December 31: Unless indicated otherwise under the appropriate county, all trout, landlocked salmon, and togue caught while open water fishing or ice fishing must be released alive at once.

Brooks, Streams and Rivers:

- From April 1 - August 15: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, open to open water fishing under general law fishing provisions (see page 5).
- From August 16 - September 30: Fishing in brooks, streams and rivers is restricted to the use of artificial lures or flies only, and the combined total daily bag limit for trout, landlocked salmon, and togue is 1 fish.
- From October 1 - March 31: Unless otherwise indicated under the appropriate county, brooks, streams and rivers are closed to all fishing. Any open to open water fishing or ice fishing between October 1 and March 31 will be indicated under the appropriate county.

Unless indicated otherwise under the appropriate county, on lakes and ponds in the Southern and Eastern counties the daily bag limit on trout is 2 fish.

Many waters have special rules that differ from the general law provisions. Check the list of individual waters under each county. If the water you wish to fish appears in that list, the letter codes will direct you to the special rule(s) which are in effect that differ from general law or the provisions for Maine's Southern and Eastern counties. The meanings of the letter codes are as follows:

- A:** Open to ice fishing and open water fishing for all fish from December 1 - April 30.
- B:** Closed to ice fishing until January 1, then open to ice fishing and open water fishing from January 1 - March 31.
- CI:** Closed to ice fishing.
- CO:** Closed to open water fishing from October 1 - March 31.
- S:** Special rule(s) in effect - Special Rules (S-codes) are listed on page 7.
(Note: Special rules may restrict the general law fishing provisions.)

Unless indicated otherwise below, on lakes and ponds in Androscoggin County the daily bag limit on brook trout is 2 fish.

Androscoggin River. (See Fish Consumption Advisories on page 98.)

- Open to ice fishing under A. S-19. Minimum length limit on landlocked salmon, rainbow trout, and brown trout: 12 inches.
- Open to open water fishing from the Maine-New Hampshire Border to tidewater from January 1 - December 31.
 - From the Maine-New Hampshire border downriver to the bridge crossing in Gilead: Single hook artificial lures only. S-7.
 - From the bridge crossing in Gilead to the Route 232 Bridge, Rumford Point:

From April 1 - September 30: S-6; daily bag limit on trout: 1 fish; minimum length limit on salmon, rainbow trout, and brown trout: 12 inches. All trout between 16 and 20 inches must be released alive at once.

From October 1 - March 31: S-6; all trout and salmon must be released alive at once.
- From the Route 232 Bridge, Rumford Point to tidewater:

From April 1 - September 30: S-19; minimum length limit on salmon, rainbow trout, and brown trout: 12 inches.

From October 1 - March 31: S-6, all trout and salmon must be released alive at once.

Androscoggin River, Little, Oxford, Minot, Poland, Auburn, etc. S-19. From Route 26 Welchville Dam in Oxford to the confluence with Androscoggin River: Open to fishing from April 1 - October 31, S-19, General Law terminal gear provisions and length limits apply from April 1 - October 31.

Auburn Lake and tributaries, Auburn. **CI.** No motor vehicles on ice (ATVs and snowmobiles allowed). S-1, S-26. Lake, tributaries and outlet to barrier dam closed to the spearing of all fish. From October 1 - November 30: Lake only open to open water fishing, S-6, S-7. Lake, tributaries, and outlet to barrier dam closed to open water fishing from December 1 - March 31.

The Auburn Water District has closed to all water-related activities (including boating and fishing) that portion southerly of a line extending from a marker placed on a point of land on the east shore of the lake approximately 400 feet southerly of the Route 4 boat launch and extending westerly to a marker on a point of land known as Point of Pines on the west shore of the lake. That portion northerly of the above described line is also closed to all water-related activities except that small recreational boats and fishing are allowed.



Nano-sized pests threaten Maine Lakes & Streams

New pests lurk just beyond Maine, waiting to invade our waters. They're small, but aggressive. You can help them hitchhike throughout Maine. Or keep them out altogether....It's up to you.



Zebra mussel size ranges from invisible larvae to up to 2-inch adults. They harm fish habitat and spread disease in wildlife.

Prevention is direct...don't transport water from lake to lake. Dry bilges, empty bait wells, and purge boat motor cooling water. A little effort goes far to prevent zebra mussels.

Rock Snot, also known as Didymo, is a microscopic alga that attacks rocky stream beds. You can't see one, but an infestation can carpet over an entire river bottom--inches thick.

How to prevent an infestation? From site to site, even on the same stream or river...

CHECK & remove any material that sticks to fishing equipment, waders, canoes, paddles, shoes and tackle.

SCRUB boots and other "hard" items with HOT water and a squirt of dishwashing detergent.

SOAK clothes, felt-soles and other "soft" items in soapy hot water for 30 minutes. Allow to dry.

WATERS IN INDIAN TERRITORY

As a result of the Maine Indian Claim Settlement Act of 1980, the Maine Indian Tribal State Commission has exclusive jurisdiction over fishing on any pond of greater than 10 acres with 50% or more of shoreline within Indian (Passamaquoddy or Penobscot) territory and any section of a river, brook or stream both sides of which are in Indian territory or one side of which is in Indian territory for a continuous length of 1/2 mile or more. The Commission has adopted rules which affect the following waters within Indian Territory. Waters subject to special provisions are so indicated. Any season, method, bag or size limits not modified in this section fall under General Law provisions (page 5).

single-pointed artificial lures; S-5 for anglers age 16 and older. August 16 - September 30: S-5. *Rest of Alder & Little Alder Streams & tributaries in Indian Territory*: S-5. North Branch Dead River: S-5.

PENOBSCOT COUNTY

Argyle Township - *Sections of Birch, East Branch Birch, and Hemlock Streams in Indian Territory*: General Law Provisions apply (page 5).

T3R1 NBPP - *Section of East Branch Passadumkeag River in Indian Territory*: General Law Provisions apply (page 5).

BOUNDARY WATERS BETWEEN MAINE AND NEW BRUNSWICK

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS ON BOUNDARY WATERS:

Either a Maine or New Brunswick License will be honored while fishing on the main body of the waters listed below, or on boundary river waters, including the main stem of the St. Croix River. Fishing on these waters in any area or cove where jurisdiction can be determined by a straight line drawn between two points of land, or fishing while positioned on shore or tied up to shore requires the appropriate agency license.

ICE FISHING

WATERS AFFECTED BY THIS SECTION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

In Aroostook County
Glazier Lake (1)
North Lake, The Thoroughfare between North Lake and East Grand Lake, and East Grand Lake (2)
St. John River, from the International Bridge in Van Buren downstream to Maine/New Brunswick border at the easternmost border of the Town of Hamlin.(4)
In Washington County
Mud Lake, East Grand Lake (2)
Spednic Lake (3)
Grand Falls Flowage east of a line between red markers on McAlister Point and Abbot's Point, and St. Croix River Flowage (Woodland Flowage)

THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS APPLY ON ABOVE WATERS:

Open Season: January 1 - March 31.

Daily bag limits

- On landlocked salmon, trout, togue, and black bass: three fish in the aggregate not to include more than 2 landlocked salmon, 2 togue;
- On whitefish - eight (8), no size or weight limit;
- On smelts - two-hundred (200), no size or weight limit;
- All other species (except Atlantic sea run salmon) - NO limits.

Minimum length limits

- Landlocked salmon: 14 inches (35 cm)
- Black bass: 10 inches (25 cm)
- Togue: 18 inches (45 cm)
- Trout: 6 inches (15 cm)

Equipment: On all waters open to ice fishing - five (5) lines per person.

Bait: Use or possession of spiny-finned fish as bait is prohibited.

Legal hours: From 1/2 hour before sunrise until 1/2 hour after sunset. (No night fishing.)

Exceptions:

- 1) Glazier Lake is open to the taking of cusk in the nighttime with 5 lines.
- 2) East Grand Lake: Daily bag limit on landlocked salmon, trout, togue, and bass: 5 fish in the aggregate, not to include more than 2 landlocked salmon, 1 togue, 1 bass, and all 5 may be brook trout. S-28.
- 3) Spednic Lake: Closed to the taking of bass; S-28.
- 4) St. John River, Van Buren to Hamlin: Total weight of landlocked salmon, trout, togue, and black bass is not to exceed 7½ pounds (3.5 kg).

OPEN WATER FISHING

WATERS AFFECTED BY THIS SECTION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

In Aroostook County - St. Francis River, Glazier Lake, St. John River (downstream from the confluence with the St. Francis River), Monument Brook, North Lake, The Thoroughfare between North Lake and East Grand Lake, and East Grand Lake.

In Washington County - East Grand Lake, Mud Lake, St. Croix River, Spednic Lake, Woodland Flowage, Grand Falls Flowage east of a line between red markers on the St. Croix River below Vanceboro from McAllister's Point and Abbott's Point, and St. Croix River Flowage.

THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS APPLY ON ABOVE WATERS:

Open Season: April 15 through September 30.

Equipment: Not more than 1 line per person.

Daily Bag Limits:

- On landlocked salmon, trout and togue (lake trout): Five (5) fish, not to include more than 2 landlocked salmon and 2 togue (lake trout), all 5 may be trout. Total weight of these fish not to exceed 7-1/2 pounds (3.5 kg).
- On black bass: April 15 – June 30: 1 fish; July 1-September 30: 3 fish.
- On smelts: 200
- On whitefish: 8 fish
- All other species (except Atlantic salmon): NO LIMITS.

Minimum Length Limits:

- Landlocked salmon: 14 inches (35 cm)
- Black bass: 10 inches (25 cm)
- Togue: 18 inches (45 cm)
- Trout: 6 inches (15 cm)

Bait: Use or possession of spiny-finned fish for bait is prohibited.

Legal Hours: From two hours before sunrise to two hours after sunset. Legal fishing hours and open season herein do not apply to the taking of smelts from waters or portions thereof naturally free of ice.

Exceptions:

- St. Croix River from Milltown Dam to the Unionville bridge line (located at the end of Todd St. in Calais): S-5.
- St. Croix River, from Grand Falls Dam down to Milltown Bridge, including the Woodland Flowage: Remains open to fishing through October. From October 1 - October 31: artificial lures only; all fish caught must be released alive at once.
- Spednic Lake and the St. Croix River from Mud Lake to Spednic Lake: Closed to the taking of bass.
- East Grand and Spednic Lakes: S-2, S-3, S-28.
- East Grand: Daily bag limit on landlocked salmon, trout, and togue: 5 fish in the aggregate, not to include more than 2 landlocked salmon, 1 togue, and all 5 may be brook trout. Daily limit on white perch: 25 fish. The 7 1/2 pound weight limit does not apply.
- North Lake, Orient: S-2, S-3.
- Woodland Flowage, Baileyville: S-28. Remains open to fishing through October. From October 1 - October 31: artificial lures only; all fish caught must be released alive at once.

BORDER WATERS BETWEEN MAINE AND NEW HAMPSHIRE

LICENSING REQUIREMENTS ON BORDER WATERS:

Fishing licenses issued to any person by either this State or New Hampshire shall be recognized when used on any lake or pond which is partly in both States of Maine and New Hampshire.

WATERS AFFECTED BY THIS SECTION ARE AS FOLLOWS:

In Oxford County

- Umbagog Lake, Upton, Maine; Errol/Cambridge, New Hampshire (waters of Umbagog Lake include the waters of the Androscoggin River upstream of the Errol Dam, the waters of the Magalloway River within the State of New Hampshire, and the waters of the Rapid River upstream to the marker at Cedar Stump in the State of Maine).

In York County

- Great East Lake, Acton, Maine; Wakefield, New Hampshire.
- Salmon Falls River, Acton, Lebanon, Berwick and South Berwick, Maine; Milton, Rochester, Somersworth and Rollinsford, New Hampshire. Included is the upper reach of the Salmon Falls River beginning at the outlet dam of Great East Lake, also known as the State Line Canal, to a point downstream marked by signage delineating the northern terminus of Horn Pond.
- Province Lake, Parsonfield, Maine; Effingham, Wakefield, New Hampshire.
- Balch and Stump Ponds, Acton, Maine; Wakefield, New Hampshire.
- Horn Pond, Acton, Maine; Wakefield, New Hampshire. Signs posted at the downstream extent of the Great East Dam Outlet Canal denotes the boundary between Horn Pond and the Salmon Falls River.

- Milton Watershed, Lebanon, Maine; Milton, New Hampshire-Milton Watershed includes all of the Milton Three Ponds-Northeast Pond, Milton Pond, Townhouse Pond (beginning at the dam in Milton to the influx of the Branch River and the Salmon Falls River).
- Lower Kimball Pond, Fryeburg, Maine; Chatham, New Hampshire.
- Spaulding Pond, Lebanon, Maine; Milton, New Hampshire.

Daily Bag Limits:

- Landlocked salmon No landlocked salmon through the ice, 2 fish open water fishing.
- Trout, and togue 5 fish, but no more than 2 landlocked salmon, 2 togue, 2 rainbow trout, 2 brown trout, or 2 brook trout.
- Pickerel..... 5 fish.
- Bass October 1 – June 20: 1 fish; June 21-Sept. 30: 3 fish (only 1 may exceed 14 inches).
- Smelt..... 2 quarts by hook and line only (Exception: Lower Kimball Pond).
- All other species No bag limits.

Any legal fish, except bait fish and smelts, taken from the waters shall be immediately released alive into the waters from which it was taken or shall be killed at once and become part of the daily bag limit.

Minimum Length Limits:

- Salmon..... 14 inches.
- Togue 18 inches (Exception: Great East Lake).
- Brook trout 6 inches (Exception: Umbagog Lake).
- Brown and Rainbow trout 10 inches in lakes and ponds — 6 inches in rivers and streams.
- Bass 12 inches.
- All Other Species No length or weight limits.

No dead or living pickerel, goldfish, yellow perch, white perch, bass, sunfish, crappie, horned pout (bullhead), carp, or any spiny finned fish shall be taken, sold, or possessed for use as bait for fishing in New Hampshire-Maine interstate waters.

ICE FISHING

GENERAL INTERSTATE ICE FISHING RULES:

- Open to ice fishing: January 1 - March 31: All species except landlocked salmon (Exception: Salmon Falls River).
- No landlocked salmon through the ice.
- No cusk fishing.
- No more than 5 lines are permitted at any one time while ice fishing (EXCEPTION: Great East Lake).

EXCEPTIONS TO THE GENERAL INTERSTATE ICE FISHING RULES:

Umbagog Lake: Closed to ice fishing is that portion of the lake north of a straight line from a red marker set on a point between Spillman and Glassby Coves on the

east shore in Maine, and a red marker set at Molls Rock, so-called, on the west shore in New Hampshire. S-18

Great East Lake: Restricted to two lines per person. Minimum length limit on togue: 16 inches. Tributaries closed to the taking of smelts.

Lower Kimball Pond: Smelt dipping is allowed between sunset and 10:00 p.m. with nets not over 18 inches in diameter.

Salmon Falls River: Closed to ice fishing.

OPEN WATER FISHING

GENERAL INTERSTATE OPEN WATER FISHING RULES:

- Open to open water fishing:
 - April 1 - September 30, open to the taking of all species.
 - October 1 - November 30, lakes and ponds are open to fishing; all trout, landlocked salmon, togue, and bass must be released alive at once.
 - December 1 - December 31, no fishing in any waters, except Salmon Falls River
- No more than 2 lines are permitted at any one time.

GEAR RESTRICTIONS:

April 1 - June 20, bass may be taken only with artificial lures and flies.

EXCEPTIONS TO THE GENERAL INTERSTATE OPEN WATER FISHING RULES:

Umbagog Lake: Open water fishing season and bag limits: S-18.

Great East Lake: Open water fishing season and bag limits: see Border Rules.

Minimum length limits: Togue - 16 inches; salmon - 14 inches; brook trout - 6 inches; brown trout and rainbow trout - 10 inches; bass - 12 inches; all other species - no length or weight limits. Tributaries closed to the taking of smelts.

Lower Kimball Pond: No exceptions to the border rules, except smelt dipping is allowed between sunset and 12:00 Midnight with nets not over 18 inches in diameter.

Salmon Falls River: Tidewater upstream to Great East Lake Dam (excluding all ponds and lakes on the river): Open to open water fishing from January 1 - December 31.

WARNING ABOUT EATING FRESHWATER FISH

Mercury in Maine freshwater fish may harm the babies of pregnant and nursing mothers, and young children.

- Pregnant and nursing women, women who may get pregnant, and children under age 8 **SHOULD NOT EAT ANY** freshwater fish from Maine’s inland waters. Except for brook trout and landlocked salmon, 1 meal per month is safe.
- All other adults and children older than 8 **CAN EAT** 2 freshwater fish meals per month. For brook trout and landlocked salmon, the limit is 1 meal per week.

Warning: Some Maine waters are polluted, requiring additional limits to eating fish. Fish caught in some Maine waters have high levels of PCBs, Dioxins or DDT in them. These chemicals can cause cancer and other health effects. The Bureau of Health recommends additional fish consumption limits on the waters listed below. Remember to check the mercury guidelines. If the water you are fishing is listed below, check the mercury guideline above and follow the most limiting guidelines.

Maine Department of Marine Resources (DMR)

It is unlawful to angle for, take, or possess anadromous Atlantic salmon from all Maine waters (including all coastal waters), unless otherwise permitted by DMR. If an Atlantic salmon is incidentally hooked it should not be removed from the water, and it should be released immediately.

Under special circumstances DMR may conduct experimental catch and release fishing seasons for Atlantic salmon at specific locations. **For information pertaining to experimental fishing seasons, or for more information on DMR, please refer to our website: <http://www.maine.gov/dmr>, or call the DMR Augusta office at (207) 287-9972**




IDENTIFICATION OF LANDLOCKED SALMON AND BROWN TROUT

The more obvious difference between landlocked salmon and brown trout may be found in the head and tail areas. Knowing them may help the angler release a fish more quickly when certain creel and size restrictions apply. On landlocked salmon, the vomerine teeth are small and arranged in a single row along the vomerine shaft, few to none on vomerine head. On brown trout, the vomerine teeth are well-developed on both vomerine head and shaft, arranged in a zig-zag row on shaft. On landlocked salmon, the caudal fin may be slightly forked and on the brown trout, the caudal fin is square and unforked.

LOONS & LEAD DON'T MIX

Lead tackle is deadly to waterbirds!

Lead sinkers and jigs cause fatal lead poisoning in loons and other waterfowl. Lead ingestion is the #1 killer of loons in Maine, but any waterbird can die from swallowing just one lead sinker or jig!

YOU CAN:

Use steel, tin, bismuth or plastic instead. Ask local tackle shops to stock alternatives.

Ask First

Most outdoor recreation in Maine takes place on private property through the generosity of the landowner.

Only by respecting landowners and their property can we be sure we will have land available in the future for the various forms of outdoor recreation we enjoy.

If you know you are welcome to use someone's land, don't abuse the privilege.

If you don't know whether you are welcome find out.

If the land is posted or you know you are not welcome, find another location.

ALWAYS SEEK PERMISSION

before engaging in any form of outdoor recreation on property which belongs to someone else.

TIPS FOR CATCHING AND RELEASING FISH

By carefully following these simple instructions, you can release your fish unharmed. If you enjoyed catching your fish, so will the next angler!

- 1. Time is of the essence.** Play and release the fish as quickly and carefully as possible. An exhausted fish may be too weak to recover.
- 2. IMPORTANT: Keep the fish in the water if it is not going to be part of your daily bag limit.** A fish out of water is not only suffocating, but may be subject to a “quick freeze.”
- 3. Be gentle.** Keep your fingers away from the gills. Don’t squeeze the fish.
- 4. Remove the hook with small pliers or a similar type tool .**
If the hook is deeply embedded or in a sensitive area such as the gills or stomach, cut the leader close to the snout. Make an effort to use regular steel (bronzed) hooks to promote early disintegration. Do not use stainless or gold-plated hooks.
- 5. To revive a fish** once it is back in the water, hold it in a swimming position in the water until it is able to swim away.
- 6. Togue (lake trout)** often have expanded air bladders after being pulled up rapidly from deep water. If the belly appears expanded, release the fish from the hook first, then gently press your thumb along the stomach near the paired belly fins and move it forward a few times to remove air from the bladder. Finally, proceed to revive and free the fish.

PREPARING FOR A CATCH-PHOTOGRAPH-AND-RELEASE CARVING

Plan ahead! Keep a soft tape measure and camera in your fishing gear. Take a few pictures of the fish to help record distinguishing characteristics and color. Measure the fish’s length (from the center of the tail to the snout) all while handling the fish out of water as little as possible. Then follow the **Tips for Catching and Releasing Fish**-above.

The information is all that a carver needs to make a replica of the catch you made and the fish is available to be caught by another lucky angler.
