This is Carolyn Ayer's mantra and educational message she has shared with students at Hermon Elementary School (HES) over her twenty-year teaching career in Hermon. Over the past 2 years, Carolyn has advised groups of third and fourth graders in an after-school environmental awareness club called the Eco-Kids Club. The group of approximately 25 students met once a month during the school year to learn about the importance of taking care of the Earth every day. At each meeting, students enjoyed healthy organic snacks, a story about the environment, and various hands-on projects to actively make a difference to the health of the Earth and their local community. From The Office of The Town Manager



Fiscal Year 2013-14 was a very challenging time not only because of the severe weather this past winter and spring but also due to several personnel changes that have occurred. In order to keep the citizens abreast of these changes I am providing you with an update.

In July 2013, Ralph Shaw was hired as the new equipment operator and Michael McCarthy was hired as the new laborer and truck driver for the Public Works Department. The new hires were necessary in order to replace Sonny Gogan who retired and Patrick Smith who went to work for the Bangor Water District. The two new employees adapted very well to the changes that were implemented by the Public Works Director to improve the effectiveness of the department in addition to assuming the responsibility for plowing and sanding this past winter ten additional miles of public ways.

In August 2013, the Penobscot Sherriff's Office took over the management and supervision for the Hermon Community Policing Unit. Sergeant Jamie Kennedy was assigned by the Sherriff to be the onsite supervisor. In addition, the Town Council included funding in the budget to hire one additional full-time deputy. Mike Parady was hired to fill the position and will be attending the Maine Criminal Justice Academy in August 2014. The primary reason for the management and supervisory changes was to implement the recommendations that had been outlined to the Town Council by the Maine Police Chiefs' Association. The focus of the report was to extend more coverage to the schools, take steps to implement the Community Policing Model and utilize the many law Enforcement services offered by the Sherriff's Office. During the 2013-2014 fiscal year, the Hermon Community Policing Unit under the supervision of Sergeant Kennedy was able to achieve the majority of the recommendations issued by the Maine Police Chiefs' Association.

During the later part of fiscal year 2013-2014, Deputy Jay Hallett resigned from the Hermon Community Policing Unit to accept a patrol officer position for the Town of Millinocket. He was replaced by Deputy Frank Jennings who has over sixteen years of law enforcement experience. Deputy Jennings served as a detective for the Penobscot Sherriff's Office and as a fraud investigator for the Canadian government. The Town of Hermon is very fortunate to have obtained the services of Deputy Jennings who we welcome to our community.

In February 2014, Beth Bowdoin resigned as assessor after 25 years of service to the Town. Efforts were made to obtain a replacement but the Town was unable to find a qualified assessor. The Town contracted with the City of Bangor until August 2014 for its assessing needs. Ben Birch, who has been the assessor for the City of Bangor for over 20 years was appointed assessor for the Town of Hermon until August 31. Assessor Birch assigned Lillian Smith, a certified Maine assessor, to staff the office twelve hours a week and to assist Assessor Birch with the preparation of the commitment. After August 31, the town will have the option of continuing with the City one more year or hiring a replacement. A qualified candidate has been identified if the Town chooses to return to a full-time assessor. If this is the choice, the duties of assessor will be extended to include the mapping needs for the Town. This will eliminate the need to hire an outside firm to complete the work and will result in savings to the Town. Also by having a full-time assessor, the Town will eliminate the need of obtaining an outside consultant to prepare a revaluation.

Beginning with the new fiscal year, all animal control functions will be carried out by the Hermon Community Policing Unit. For a number of years these responsibilities were carried out by Jimmy Cornforth. The Town chose to make the change because of the need to have an Animal Control Officer who is state certified and who has the authority to issue summonses. Because Hermon deputies are responsible for issuing summonses, it was determined it would be more effective for them to assume all responsibilities for domestic animal control. If you have an emergency regarding a domestic animal you should call 911. If the situation is not an emergency and it involves a domestic animal, please call 945-4636.

After sixteen years of service to the Town of Hermon as Economic and Community Development Director, Ron Harriman chose not to pursue renewal of his contract. Ron served the Town of Hermon very well during his tenure and many economic development achievements were realized as well as the development of the Village District improvements. In order to continue to provide an affordable and effective Economic and Community Development Program to existing and new businesses and citizens of Hermon, the Town Council agreed to extend the position to full-time and to house the position at the Town Office. The position was advertised either as a contracted or a salaried position. There was no response from consultants but over twenty applications were received for the salaried position. The experience of the applicants ranged from over twenty years to recent college graduates. It is expected a new economic development director will be on board by the end of July. The new position will focus not only on bringing new businesses to Hermon but also assisting existing businesses. As soon as the candidate is approved by the Town Council, the public will be notified.

Even with the many personnel changes, financially the year ended very well. No department over drafted its budget and the Unrestricted Fund Balance is projected to increase by at least \$200,000 to \$300,000 after all bills have been paid. In addition, the Town Council had set thirty-two goals of which twenty-four were achieved and eight were either not pursued due to personnel changes and/or could not be achieved due to lack of time. All of the goals not completed will be included in the list of goals for the 2014-15 fiscal year.

Consumer Fireworks Ordinance

The Hermon Town Council recognizes that while the State of Maine has legalized the use of consumer fireworks, they still present a danger of injury and fire. To enhance the public safety and welfare of its citizens and community the Town Council adopted an ordinance to prohibit use and sale of Consumer fireworks in the Town of Hermon.

No person shall use, possess with the intent to use, sell, possess with the intent to sell or offer for sale consumer fireworks in the Town of Hermon. This section does not apply to a person issued a fireworks display permit by the State of Maine pursuant to 8 M.R.S.A. 227-A.

Whoever violates this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of up to \$1,000.00 plus reasonable attorney and witness fees, plus costs if legal action by the Town of Hermon is required.

Curbside Trash Rules Placement at Roadside

Rubbish will not be collected unless the following conditions are met:

1. Rubbish shall be placed in rodent proof, leak proof and essentially air tight metal or plastic cans or in tied plastic refuse bags.
2. Containers or bags shall be placed as accessible to the roadside as possible so as not to interfere with vehicles, pedestrian traffic or snow removal activities.
3. Containers, bags or bundles shall not exceed (40) forty pounds.
4. Rubbish shall be placed roadside on the designated day of collection by 7:00 a.m.

JROTC Service Learning Project at the IOOF

The Hermon High JROTC Hawk Battalion Cadets organized, planned, and led a service learning project in the building of the Superintendent's Office in March to help renovate the top floor with a fresh coat of two-toned paint. Kyle Barnes, the Executive Officer of the Hawk Battalion, led the cadets through every stage of the operation as the project manager. Their three goals were to complete the project as soon as possible to minimize disruption to the daily operations of Superintendent Patricia Duran's workspace, complete the project as a strictly cadet-led and resourced project, and finally, provide a newly renovated meeting space for the Hermon School Department. All three goals were expeditiously met within a remarkable three days of labor with over thirty cadets who were involved. The project included an interview with Mrs. Duran to gather project requirements and expectations, support from the head of maintenance Mr. Jason Davis for supplies, and technical training from a carpenter and cadet parent Mr. Jeremy Bemis. Before cadets dove into the labor portion of the project, they conducted a safety briefing to ensure that safety was top priority especially when they had to reach heights well above ten feet. There was another interview with Mrs. Duran to capture some historical facts about the history of the building. Most people pass by the building and see it as the IOOF, as prominently displayed in large letters, which stands for the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. As years passed, the local IOOF eventually donated the building to the Town of Hermon with the agreement that the IOOF membership would still be allowed to utilize the lower floor for meeting space and this agreement has remained ever since. Here is an excerpt from the IOOF website explaining a bit about their organization:

The Independent Order of Odd Fellows began in 18th Century England. It was deemed odd to find people organized for the purpose of giving aid to those in need without recognition and pursuing projects for the benefits of all mankind. Our deep history began in North America, with the United States and Canada in 1819, and is continually expanding throughout the World where we are a worldwide fraternity in 26 countries. The Odd Fellows and Rebekahs are striving to make the world a better place in which to live, seeking To Improve and Elevate the Character of Mankind. The members of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows are sometimes referred to "Odd Fellows" or "Rebekahs." Odd Fellows have also become known in many areas as "The Three Link Fraternity" which is evidenced by our world-wide "Three Link Emblem" which stands for Friendship, Love and Truth. These three links symbolize the chain that binds our members together and illustrates that our Communities, States, Provinces and Nations are strongest when joined together.

The project was wrapped up with a PowerPoint presentation to a couple of members of the Hermon School Committee, the Superintendent of Schools, and the Principal and Vice Principal of Hermon High to emphasize the positive impact that the JROTC program has had on the students and the community as a result of this recent project. The cadets complete a service learning project each year by determining needs throughout the community. The JROTC Hawk Battalion leadership course continues to be the most rapidly growing elective course among high school students. So far, nearly one hundred students have signed up for the next school year.
